### **PK's Points**

Sometimes the Bible surprises us. Sometimes we are surprised by what it says and then there are other times that we are surprised by what it does not say. There are social media postings that ask for you to share phrases or concepts that people think are in the Bible but actually are not – such as "the Bible says that God helps those who help themselves", or that "the Bible says that when God closes one door, He opens another." Nice, pithy sayings, but not taken straight from the Bible.

A number of weeks ago, in our study of the book of 1 Timothy on Wednesday evenings, we spent some time considering the reality that as God inspired Paul to write various New Testament books and address slaves and slave-owners various times throughout a number of these books, that the Bible, surprisingly, did not come right out and openly condemn the practice of slavery. The absence of a clear statement may surprise us, but that doesn't mean that the Bible condoned slavery one bit. In fact, Biblical principle after principle after principle after principle (do you get the point?) repeatedly would teach of the equality of all people, condemn the mistreatment of people, raise the bar on the concept of freedom and brotherhood, and champion love, justice, mercy, and honor to all. We realize that slavery in Roman culture was much different than the blight of early American culture. But it was slavery nonetheless, and the Bible does not address it head-on. We might wonder as to why that is until we begin to see what the Bible does focus on. For chapter after chapter of the New Testament stays focused on the Gospel of Jesus Christ. For Christ did not come for social reform (the abolishment of slavery), but He came for spiritual renewal (salvation of mankind). And despite all of the social issues of the 1<sup>st</sup> century in the Romans Empire, God's Word remains laser-focused on the Gospel.

Guess what we, as the Church, should focus on? The Gospel.

This does not absolve us of getting involved with social issues but it actually should motivate us to be courageous in sharing our views on matters. That, because of the Gospel, we know God and are able to know His Word as it gives us authoritative principles and commands to back our positions and views. For example, we understand that when it comes to the social issue of abortion, that we know that abortion is not just a political battle, it is a spiritual one. For God's Word teaches that life begins at conception and so putting an end to an unborn through abortion is the wrongful taking of one's life.

Social issues come about quickly. And it seems as if there are more and more stepping up to the plate all the time. And even though we are blessed to live in a great nation, we must admit that it is far from perfect. Imperfect people who have developed good, at first, but imperfect systems that now seem to be showing their fault lines. The systems that are showing their fault lines are now running into opposition who are capitalizing (no pun intended) on the errors of an imperfect system, protesting and advocating for a pendulum swing of a completely new system (Did someone say socialism?).

And so we run to the scriptures, seeking an answer as to how humankind is to form their economy, government and social structure. We find, maybe to one's surprise, what the Bible does not say, as it does not spell out any governing structures. However, I believe there are a vast number of principles found throughout God's Word that would lend itself towards capitalism. I believe that with capitalism comes greater freedom and responsibility and stewardship opportunities, and many other things that God's Word teaches, promotes, and values. However, if some-day, the pendulum would ever swing, let's remember that our primary focus must always be the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The problem is though, that with the governmental need for control in socialistic countries, what we have seen is that because God's Word advocates for personal freedom and equality, etc..., that socialist governments will eventually put an end to religious freedom.

However, it has been said that when there is persecution, the church grows. Christ said that even the "gates of Hades" would not prevail over His Church. Therefore, we are struck with the understanding that the focus of our lives and church should be the Good News of salvation and freedom of sin through Jesus Christ. And that should remain the focus regardless of the political climate, social structure, or economic position we find ourselves in. May this be true of us, individually, and collectively, as Hillside, as we continue *learning together* in order to be found *living transformed*.

We have an exciting Fall to the end of the year planned with our Fall Fellowship (October) and Carry-In meals (September, November & December), as well as our normal service times to interact, fellowship and worship together. We'll start September off with a Baptism Service and a few headed to Missionary Acres. A few weeks ago, in our AM message, there was a reference to some special prayer services that we would like to see take place on Sept. 29, Oct. 27, and Nov. 10. These services will be committed to praying for Hillside, for God to continue to use Hillside for His purpose, for Him to show us how to reach people in a greater/deeper way, and for Him to expand our ministry as He sees fit. The start time for these services will be either 4:30 or 6:00 PM on these days and should conclude within an hour. Our Fall Fellowship is being planned for Oct. 6. November will bring a Ladies' Retreat (Nov. 1-2) and December will be a full month of celebrating Christ's birth.


